In our worship on August 6th I will happily introduce you to several members of my family who will join us – share some singing, perhaps some reflections. They are quite musical and one is a pastor; and some piano and guitar. Let's celebrate together around the Lord's Table.

The seven of us will begin backpacking the following day upward the Teton Canyon Trail, over Alaska Basin into Death Canyon, through to Teton Crest, then ending at Teton Village—"over the river and through the woods". And we begin this adventure...worshipping with you – around the Feast of Christ's Table. Actually, the gospel story Sunday is: The Feeding of the 5,000.

This Feast is a lifelong way of giving language and meaning to **God's Love That Overflows.** In the ancient Hebrew scriptures 'the feast' is the primary image for God's abundance for called people. In many contexts, like Psalm 23, the feast is this image of trusting God in times of scarcity—"You prepare a table before me in the presence of my enemies...my cup overflows". Likewise in this Matthew story is the abundant nourishment for a seeking crowd (sometimes named 'sheep without a shepherd') who are fulfilled in the midst of the threatening, often dangerous, un-sustaining wilderness.

Made known to the people of Shepherd of the Mountains Lutheran Church is the promise that God's power is quite different than the empire's power. Many of today's powers resemble the Herod of Jesus' day—where deceit and oppression plague us and our neighbor—life under threat, not whole, and resources are hoarded (thus scarce). In contrast, Jesus' power is so different, where the images include: *"he saw the crowd; and he had compassion"* and he *"blessed and broke and loaves, ...and ALL ate and were filled"*. This presence and love of Jesus fills up, overflows. And here also is the unique promise of God: <u>Everybody eats at God's Feast</u>. You can hear of sustenance and safety for the life of your neighbor...as people are influenced by 'the Feast of Abundance'? What Good News and generosity we have to share!

As we studied the Psalm for this Sunday, we also read what is often shared as a table blessing. Perhaps you will incorporate this into your next meal:

The eyes of all wait upon you, O Lord. And you give them their food in due season. You open wide your hand and satisfy the desire of every living thing. Psalm 145:8-9 – A TABLE PRAYER

And upon this table is spread this ancient promise in Psalm 145:15-16—made full, clear, and real in Jesus, where we are invited to bank our whole lives. At this table of abundance is where we are fulfilled, with plenty to pass on to our loved ones, neighbors, and strangers:

The Lord is gracious and full of compassion, slow to anger and abounding in steadfast love. Lord, you are good to all, and your compassion is over all your works.

Part 5) LOOKING FOR A VISION. God transforms our ways of seeing, giving us a vision.

Part 6) We give language and commitment to: OUR MISSION.
