

#### ADVENT & CHRISTMAS - How to be...in all this waiting



Which is why Advent is a favorite for me – **It's always here:** our life of anticipation, with yearning and the various ways we are looking ahead, and with hope there is something new – life that is becoming more whole in God's graces. "Yes, we are Advent people."

And as students of Advent faith, and followers of the living Christ, a large part of this journey is described as waiting upon the promises and mysteries (and even present realities) of God's Incarnation in this world. Ultimately, our faith is dancing with the invitation and experiences of noticing and participating in the nature of God to be Immanuel—God with us.

So as you are waiting, and this world waits—gradually becoming incredibly busy in this cultural season named 'the holidays', shall we take to heart the center of the story? Perhaps you have heard sentiment like this:

# Jesus is not 'part of the story of Christmas'. Christmas is 'part of the story of Jesus'

So I'm wondering if a deciding factor in our Advent Faith isn't about: 'HOW we practice our waiting'—the life-giving possibilities we might open ourselves to. How might we fill our moments of waiting with deeper meaning?

Here's one great idea I encourage you with: when I was a child, ever since I can remember, my family would observe candle lighting and prayer with an Advent wreath. And ever since those days, I have favored the gift of lighting candles in Advent.

At our church we have prepared all you need to get your own Advent wreath started in your home and enlightening you into the Christmas season. Please consider this or any other ways of opening yourself to the promise of God with us.

And remember that *Christmas is 'part of the story of Jesus'* – a profound story that makes all the difference in a life of waiting and wondering...because of the promise and mystery that God is here.

## It's Almost Time to Decide

In 2021-22 Assistant to the Bishop Rev. Phil Misner, guided the church council through the call process after Pastor Inger departed. He and then Bishop Kristen Kuempel suggested calling a Transitional Minister. This different approach would allow the council to search for a pastor with an eye on a long-term commitment. The transitional pastor would commit to serve Shepherd of the Mountains for a two-year period.

At the 18-month mark of this two-year commitment the pastor and the congregation would each decide if a regular call to the pastor is desired. If either party decides not to continue together, the transitional minister would help Shepherd of the Mountains begin a new call process. In mid-August 2022, Pastor Tim became our Transitional Minister.

We are approaching the 18-month milestone in Pastor Tim's two-year contract. We would like to ask you to prayerfully consider if you would like him to continue as our pastor.

As part of this decision process, the congregation is invited to a mutual conversation on this topic with Pastor Tim after the service on Sunday December 3rd.

Your Council leadership will function like before, as the Call Committee.

And our final decision (if Pastor Tim is recommended by the Call Committee) will come to a vote following our annual meeting in January, 2024.




# Our Congregational Story

#### **November Church Council Meeting**

Highlight of discussions and planning - keeping our congregation informed.

- 1) Commitments to Giving for 2024 increased from 2023; actual giving among '23 commitments is close to 100%. Great news.
- 2) Deciding upon 4 to 6 Guiding Principles: we continue our discernment. Our congregation has provided great responses. We're not a hurry; gaining clarity about our future directions.
- 3) A new program for young families on Sunday mornings will soon be underway.
- 4) Possible new pianist, accompanying worship on Dec 17th.
- 5) Preparations: for ByLaw/Special congregation meeting on Nov 19th and Annual mtg on Jan 28th
- 6) Financial Stability we are gaining talking points and new actions; also will be ongoing
- 7) Preliminary discussion of putting a portion of Endowment Funds into a CD. Final decision to take place in '24
- 8) Pastor & Congregation Conversation Dec 3 after worship; Scott will serve as moderator
- 9) Council will serve as Call Committee again; a decision will be made at Dec 10 council mtg; congregation would vote at Annual mtg Jan  $28^{th}$
