Dear Sisters and Brothers,

I've heard the breakneck speed and tone of change in our present world described as a "profound disorientation"—about this culture and world, from corrosive politic to cataclysmic climate, to broken sense of connectedness with neighbor. How shall our church respond?

Where we respond...with worship life together, with gatherings of friendship and food (to sustain relationships and start new ones), with leaders planning and all generations of brothers and sisters opening scriptures and hearts in prayer for a life-giving word, and with fresh exploration taking place about the needs and gifts of our neighbors...there is another sense of speed—the speed of trust.

Our present time together—as pastor and congregation—is given the name *Transitional Call*. And I am so thankful how our gifted council leadership arrived at a centering decision "to invite and include everyone" in this process together named Renewal of Our Congregation. Here we are moving at a speed of trust and connectedness that welcomes the Spirit of Christ to guide our collective experience of change. And our speed of trust incorporates the sacred connection of making this spiritual journey together.

(And let his vital step be noted: that the experience of renewal in a congregation rarely 'takes root' when only a few are commissioned to 'go alone into an upper room'—in prayer, in scripture, bathed in Spirited conversations—to make key decisions about the future and culture of a congregation. Rather, we are trusting that renewal takes place where the whole body is called into this transformative work of God's Spirit—through listening, learning, trusting, discerning, etc.)

Here, I entrust to you this timely prayer, located in our hymnal, which speaks to our present adventure of transition and trust.

Lord God, you have called us to ventures of which we cannot see the ending, by paths as yet untrodden, through perils unknown. Give us good courage, not knowing where we go, but only that your hand is leading us and your love supporting us, through Jesus Christ Our Lord. Amen.

May we all respond with good courage, and with a sense of unity that is central to our understanding of our Triune God, and becomes grounded in a speed of trust that attends to the life and faith of one another through this present adventure and into the next.

Thanks be to God who transforms our thinking and living—who is always raising us to new life in Christ.

Remembering the Emanuel 9 In Our Prayers

A REMEMBRANCE...ABOUT RACE, VIOLENCE, AND OUR CALL TO RESTORATION

This remembrance will be included in our worship on Sunday, June 18th

Emanuel Nine, martyrs, 2015 As part of the 2019 ELCA Churchwide Assembly, voting members adopted a resolution designating June 17 as a commemoration of the martyrdom of the Emanuel 9—the nine people shot and killed on June 17, 2015, during a Bible study at Emanuel African Methodist Episcopal Church in Charleston, S.C

Two of the slain were pastors who graduated from our Lutheran seminary. The shooter was a young Lutheran and self-professed white supremacist; he said he wanted to spark a 'race war'.

Our relationship to the shooter, as well as two of the slain, reminds us of both our complicity and our calling. Together we name the trauma of generations of racism and white supremacy and, at the same time, we rejoice in the freedom that is ours in Christ Jesus who "has broken down the dividing wall, that is, the hostility between us" (Ephesians 2:14). May God continue to guide us as we seek repentance and renewal, and racial justice and reconciliation among all God's precious children.

Prayer: Immanuel - God with us - you embrace in love those who cry out to you. Lift up all whom hatred has cast down; embolden those who need courage to speak and act against oppression; sustain those who are weary from efforts that bring no end to injustice. Comfort parents weeping for children, children who have been separated from parents, and families in crises of any kind. Restore hope where it has been lost, so that all may trust your love that reaches to the depths of pain and suffering. In your great mercy, Amen.

Synod Assembly Update

Dear members of SOTM. Dale and I wish to thank you for sending us to the assembly, we had an amazing journey.

Thankfully Pastor Tim invited to carpool with him. We left early Friday morning and made the 10 hour drive in good time. The Snake River gave us breathtaking sights for a good part of the day. For those of you who haven't had the privilege of attending a synod assembly, you need to know that the worship services fill a person to the brim. 200 plus voices raised in singing and praying give one a real sense of belonging to God's large family.



Saturday was a busy day for all. Bible Study (Luke 24) was led by Reverend Barbara Rossing. It's the story Jesus meeting two of his disciples as they journeyed to Emmaus. They didn't recognize Jesus until later in the day when He broke the bread. My notes: we are the same as the disciples in that we may not recognize Jesus in people who may not look or act like us. We are called to be an outpost of compassion...to love, mend and send.

The ELCA church wide representative, Deacon Sue E Rothmeyer addressed the assembly with news of how the church is working in our world. Some stats: \$20 million towards world hunger initiatives, 23 million in Lutheran disaster support, 11 new start up ministries, 87,000 in Grants given out this year

The General Secretary of the Ulanga Kilombero Diocese was in attendance and shared news from our companion synod. There are 65 million Lutherans in Tanzania. We are a part of God's larger family!!

During the day, elections were held. The election for bishop narrowed the field from 6 candidates to one. Our new bishop is Rev. Meggan Manlove from Trinity Lutheran in Nampa, Id. She was ordained in 2004. One of her favorite Bible verses comes from the book of Revelations: The leaves of the tree are for the healing of the nation."

Pastor Tim was elected to a 6 year term on the discipline committee. 5 resolutions were voted on. Resolution 1 centered on a constitutional amendment. Resolution 2 was an amendment to change the SHARE fund policy. Resolutions 3, 4 and 5 are attached along with this page. Sunday morning was: breakfast, elections of synod wide reps and ending with worship. Since we had another 10 hour drive ahead of us, we left after breakfast.

The good old Snake River led us home with more gorgeous views.

Invite: Discussion of resolutions – Sunday, June 18 after worship.

Synod Resolutions

- •Resolution 3 was a resolution to **encourage the development and support of diaper banks** within our communities.
- •Resolution 4 was a *resolution in support of the dignity, honor, and rights of transgender humans.* This came about largely in response to the legalized discrimination of trans folk in Idaho (part of our synod), and many other parts of our country. The resolution asks that we proclaim God's love for trans folk; declare our intention to love them unconditionally; encourage our congregations to welcome trans folk, affirm their humanity and dignity, and joyfully receive them into membership and into the mission we share; encourage congregations to pray publicly in Sunday worship for the well-being of trans folk; and encourage congregations to study and gain knowledge of challenges facing trans folk, enter into dialogue "with holy curiosity" regarding trans experience, and speak and act in ways that honor the lives of transgender people. This resolution passed unanimously, with no dissenting votes or comments.
- •Resolution 5 was to *condemn the use of the firing squad as a method of execution* in the state of Idaho, and condemn the use of capital punishment in all forms.
