INTENTIONAL CARE TO BODY AND SOUL - THAT'S LENT

It clearly begins with a plunge – Lent – especially this year. Because of 'a more intense snow storm' last week, we postponed Shrove Tuesday and included Ash Wednesday in our First Sunday in Lent. So with the sign of the cross, followed by a pancake reception, we leapt in: a deep dive into our mortality, and the disciplines of Lent, and a great meal together, while worship included our next theme of Renewing Our Congregation—finding our voice in Christ. It was a big splash.



Lent's beginning was a full Sunday and "Yes, we are intentional this Lent": paying close attention to following Jesus' journey to the cross while taking steps we all know are necessary for personal faith and for our congregation's life and vitality in this time and place. We are invited to go deep into taking care.

Yet I want to suggest that the tone of this Lenten season, even in the midst of the call—to turn, repent, and be cleaned of sin, is one of OPTIMISM. The images on Sundays are filled with the surprises—of new sight for a 'know it all' Nicodemus, of the 'invitation to the unlikely' through the socially condemned woman at the well, of a healing of eyes that addresses 'the blindness to shame', and of an 'unbinding of grave cloths' in the midst of deep grief and despair.

These Lenten images of faith are not about wallowing in sin. Ultimately they are about taking care of our body and soul. Lent is not for punishing or depravity, but body-building and soul-nourishment. The church has always known, even though we can lose sight in a kind of wailing and gnashing of teeth. Which is why Lent has traditionally been of significant timing for those preparing for Baptism: it is the season of being alert to salvation – for learning about the experience of being forgiven, and being made whole...of what transformation in Christ call us into.

Repentance may tear down what is twisted or corrosive, but it also builds up that which is of God.

You are INVITED: both inward and outward with the traditional disciplines of prayer and fasting and acts of love, but not punishment. These are part of our spiritual exercises—life-building techniques. They are not mortification, just as the cross is changed (transformed) from an instrument of torture. Our intentional steps in Lent are God at work in us to make us alive, renewed for the surprises and joys of Easter.

- 1. The Spirit guides Jesus into the wilderness where he comes face to face with temptation and struggle. The most important things come into view.
- 2. Nicodemus comes to Jesus under the cover of night, desperate for concrete answers. We are searching in the wilderness.
- 3. The people of Israel thirst in the wilderness and the woman at the well is invited to drink of the never-ending stream of life.
- 4. The man born blind escapes the wilderness and the healing of Jesus surprises everyone.
- 5. While we tend of think of the wilderness as empty, barren, and dead. Yet life will break open in a dry valley of bones and in the lifeless frame of Lazarus.
