Our Purpose: Receiving God's grace. Sharing Christ's love with all people

Letting God reshape our questions. Letting God reshape our hearts.

Love the Lord your God with all your hearts and with all your soul and with all your mind. This is the first commandment.

And the second is like it: 'Love your neighbor as yourself.'—Matthew 22:37-39



We are a vibrant community of faith with renewed language for our purpose (which responds to: why are we here? why do we exist?). The purpose statement we chose is:

Receiving God's grace. Sharing Christ's love with all people.

Great! What an incredible description of our relationship with God—the inward and outward movement of faith in everywhere, everyday life. As our council leaders pointed out, "It's like breathing—breathing in the goodness of God, and then breathing out this same goodness as God's servants."

Herein is the grounding and the roots of our faith – to be listening to God's voice, open and receptive to much more than our own thoughts, our own mind, our desires and agendas and schedules. Then outwardly, in response to the vast, loving generosity of God, we 'put on' the mission of Christ to "love your neighbor as yourself." In the same manner our baptismal language balances these two dimensions: 'putting on Christ' like a robe of gracious mercy and love for you; and simultaneously wearing the servant's robe as Christ actively loving our hurting, hungering, and thirsting neighbor.

We do not need to go out and find love; rather, we need to be still and let love discover us. —John O'Donohue

SOME OF OUR QUESTIONS

Sometimes our questions may sound like, "How do we get more people into our doors?" Obviously, this is a part of our mission—enlarge our community. And alongside I overhear a hopeless sentiment that says, "But I have no agency" – in other words, "I don't know anyone to invite." Or "I am not so useful for getting out there and reaching out to people in our town who hunger and thirst for God and a community of love."

SHALL WE CONSIDER BETTER, MORE FAITHFUL, QUESTIONS

These questions and concerns may hit home as our sense of 'usefulness' feels small (even diminishing). Perhaps some responds with, "It's just too hard...because everybody in society seems to just keep to themselves"—which sounds like fear, defense, or defeat. Yet I wonder if we might consider better, more faithful questions, closer to home than we imagined: How do I love? In this world of struggling people for community and connection and healing and restoration...what shape might love become in me? Where/how might I be open to God changing my sense of love for my neighbor? for the stranger?

In December, and January 2024, our congregation will begin exploring new places together. The fresh questions include: How do I love where I live, where the 'close to home question' for each of us is "How will God change my heart to grow in love for all who I meet?"

Stay tuned for this effort (led by the Outreach Board)—Love where you live.

All Saints' Day



This Sunday is All Saints' Day. You are invited to Light a Candle of Remembrance; Gather around the Lord's Table; Celebrate God's Promises for 'ALL the generations of saints' who have gone before us.

In the Middle Ages the Church celebrated both All Saints' Day and All Souls' Day. All Saints' Day was the day when the Church remembered the Christian martyrs, i.e. those who had died because of their faith, whereas All Souls' Day was the day when the Church commemorated and prayed for the dead. The idea was to help the dead

go through purification in purgatory and enter into heaven by praying for them. At the Reformation in the 16th century the existence of purgatory as a place of punishment or purification was rejected. Consequently, All Souls' Day was abolished. The Church kept All Saints' Day to commemorate those who died for the sake of their faith.

We hope you will bring a friend for this special day of remembrance.

Stewardship 2024

So, where have you heard such language before? – It's the new Purpose Statement of our congregation. We want this year's stewardship emphasis to be centered on the source of our generosity. 
