FROM YOUR PASTOR & CONGREGATIONAL PRESIDENT

Dear fellow members of Shepherd of the Mountains Lutheran Church:

Your pastor and president are writing to you in review of a challenging matter for us: our church is in a precarious financial situation. We've been aware that in calling a Transitional Pastor our expenses would exceed our giving for some time while we gradually grow. Likewise, we've known that in order to keep up with our ministry expenses, we will borrow from our own savings on a monthly basis.

Overall these savings would be able to sustain us through approximately 3 1/2 years at our present pace (and thus far we have not drawn from our endowment account). And here is great news about our financial giving: in 2023, we have been faithful and strong in our giving to the level of an increase compared to previous years. The point here is: We are a generous and resourceful people.

At the same time we've been listening together about our call to grow—grow in our ministries and mission, grow in our financial giving and creative resourcing (for example, other sources of funding: partnerships, renting our facility, etc.), and grow in daily relationship with Christ with us.

This is true: we don't know what kind of growth will become our new story, but we are listening to *God's voice among us* with dreams and visions—for the past 9 months we have been earnestly dedicated to hearing the <u>scriptures</u>, conducting many faith <u>conversations</u> (often in worship), and opening our "heart, mind, strength, and soul" in <u>prayer</u> about what God wants for our church.

Receiving God's grace. Sharing Christ's love to all people is our new sense purpose. And in the next weeks we are choosing Guiding Principles which aim our lives to excel in key values we share.

Please join together in prayer for a new mindset in becoming more of Christ's church. We will continue to inform you on developments in our life together. God bless all our renewing work.
