A SIMPLE TRANSFORMATION STORY

I enjoyed a recent conversation with a friend I've known for years...and learned some new, recreative things. He's one of the most interesting Christians I know (in an inspiring kind of way) —always getting involved in urban church ministries that are quite edgy, like affordable housing (not just an urban issue, as we know), healing ministries (for body, spirit, or community), bridges out of poverty, etc. Alongside this he is a natural – 'compassionate, face to face' kind of guy – people quickly appreciate his listening & caring style.



[How bout that!...he's bold for God's justice AND...nurturing—tender with people (in this disjointed world.) And honestly, in my work as a pastor I constantly envision this goodness among us. I am certain that it changes hearts; changes world, for that matter. Our mission statement, too, has this active love language, right from the get go: "Sharing Christ's love with all people."]

Perhaps the questions for many is: where do I restart...in learning to love my neighbor?

In that conversation with my friend, I heard for the first time: When he was a hurting—a young man struggling with life after his divorce—awkwardly navigating his feelings and quietly seeking after his own healing. Yet, as he puts it, "I was hiding." "I joined a large Lutheran church in Minnesota; working on what I thought was my essential faith stuff and pretty much 'kept to myself'." "Then someone invited me into a larger world; they invited me to lunch." Everything began to change after that. He got to know someone better—someone who simply cared, listened.

For him, this one invitation to 'get to know you better' was the beginning of a whole new sense of faith and Christian community. This simple gesture from another member of the church, who he knew a little, reached out to befriend and really rocked his boat. And now, on a regular basis (monthly, he told me) he does this with other people in his church – he goes up to someone he's come to know in the church a little, and asks: "would like to visit sometime?"

Now, this is this practice: he keeps an eye out for someone that he might invite to lunch, or coffee, or any kind of visit of 'their choice' where a conversation is able to open. He shares about his own life – his present marriage and children and job and family and life in this world. But he intentionally spends most of this sacred time...listening and making a new friend.

Long ago what my friend experienced was a new opening of 'love for your brother and sister'. And since then, he is still transforming how he lives and loves and serves in this world, starting right in his own congregation.

PS: He is also incredible with people he hasn't met before. I wonder if starting small and local is what has been a part of his transformation—reaching in this world of too much separation.

PSS: Thanks be to God! for the ways these kind of things are happening in our congregation.

Funding Forward - Congregational Meeting on June 30th

Grateful! Grateful! for the good attendance, wise leadership, and fruitful conversations at this hour long+ meeting. Council leaders prayed, presented updated info about our financial unfolding, and primarily shared new ways that our congregation can grow our offerings, outside of our regular giving. The main point: there are resources in synods, and non-profits, and businesses to assist our 'securing financial sources for our church's mission long into the future' Here are some of our talking points:



- 1) Overall everything, living our renewed mission as a body with our neighbors, and with potential partnerships in this community.
- 2) Potentially expanding rental arrangements with other faith communities, non-profits, or businesses.
- 3) Potentially leveraging our owned assets of land, church building, and the parsonage in lease arrangements, renting, etc.
- 4) Possibilities of constructing on our church property for other lease or renting arrangements, pastor housing, or a bundling of these, etc.
- 5) Creative arrangement for pastor's compensation through sharing hours with another church, housing in an other location (and rent parsonage for total value), bi-vocational pastor (with 2nd job that reduces congregation's salary obligation), etc. (PS: many of these are Pastor Tim's ideas)

Because this was 'an informational meeting', our council invites these conversations to continue freely; all are invited into this exploration together. Please contact your council leader(s) and pastor if you would appreciate more info and/or share insights. More information will come your way in a timely manner; no voting will take place until all are fully informed. Thank you!

The Bishop's Visit & Brunch



On June 16th, Bryan Brydges became a baptized member of our church family during the service. Bryan's parents came out to witness his blessed day.


