## WINDS OF CHANGE, FIRE OF PASSION

At Pentecost, the Holy Spirit showed up with sound and force like the wind. Those present saw what seemed to be tongues like fire. In this powerful way, the Spirit brought unity among the people. When the Holy Spirit showed up, the people could understand each other. Although they were from all over the world, they were able to speak each other's languages and understand each other for the first time. God did a new thing.

God is still doing a new thing in our lives today, still firing us up. The Holy Spirit remains with us, still burning like a hot flame and blowing like wind, opening our ears to hear and understand the people around us, empowering us for the rest of our days so we might share the story of Jesus.

What would happen if even more we started really hearing and understanding the language spoken by our neighbor — not just the spoken language of our geography but the language of our lived experiences?

As we go through life, do we hear our neighbor crying for help? Do the rich hear the voice of the poor? Do those with jobs hear the voice of those without? Do those with homes hear the voice of those who live on the street? Do adults hear the voice of youth? Do those who do not have physical mobility issues hear the voice of those who do?

In our church, do we hear the voice of people with a different lived Lutheran experiences than our own? Do Lutherans who are white hear the voices of people of color? Do lifelong Lutherans hear the voices of new Lutherans? Do Lutherans from one locale hear the voices of Lutherans from another locale? Do those who are already active Lutherans hear the voices of those who are visiting, hoping to find their place?

Do we not only hear but understand? Do we hear the story of Jesus in the stories of those all around us? The Holy Spirit is blowing among us, sparking a fire within us, opening our ears to hear the voices that go unheard among us, inviting us to move beyond hearing and understanding to action — to be the hands and voice and feet of God in the community.

Understanding each other's language was just the beginning for the people gathered in that room on Pentecost. They left there and went all over the world to share the good news of Jesus' love and salvation. Understanding each other is just the first step. Next we are led by the Spirit into mission to bring about change.

This Pentecost, may the Holy Spirit blow us out of our comfort zones into new places and new spaces to engage people we have never engaged before. May we be ignited with new ways to serve to bring about the mission of God in our communities.

May the winds of the Holy Spirit lead us to break down boundaries that divide. May the fire of the Holy Spirit ignite us to speak life to a broken world.

Come, Holy Spirit. Come!

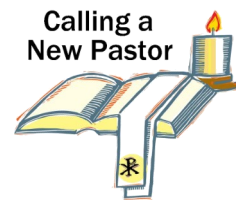

**Synod Gathering Review** by Rose Jeske

*The Northwest Intermountain Synod Regional Gathering took place on May 14 in Burley, Idaho.*

Reflections from the day:

Dale, myself, and Sherry Kinsella were glad we could represent SOTM at this event.

We met as a large group and also as small groups of 3 or 4 during the day.

We were led through God's story of Paul and Timothy's travels as recorded in Acts 16: 1-15. They had made a travel plan that God changed. They would go, then get stopped by the Spirit, turn around and go forward. The Spirit continued to intervene until they arrived in Macedonia.

Our large group was identified by the generation we were in. No surprise, the baby boomer generation was the largest one represented !

All of the generations were asked to reflect on life changing events of those times. This led us to break into small groups to share our story and listen to other's stories. For me, this small group time was very meaningful. The last two years were identified as being life changing for all. The COVID pandemic caused most of the people I talked with to stop, turn around, try going forward, only to have to do it over and over.

We found common ground in listening and finding that we aren't alone in our feelings. The journey is continuing. We're all weary. The Synod staff shared that they have those same feelings. We're in uncharted territory, similar to Paul and Timothy's journey. We can be assured that as we step forward to where we feel we need to be, we're not alone. God is with us.

SOTM is part of God's plan. Through the years, we've had to stop, turn around, go forward, then stop AGAIN, turn around and go forward.

I believe that as we continue to take time to listen to each other, affirm one another as beloved children of God, and pray for one another, we'll trust that we're not alone. God is with us as we travel SOTM's journey together.

## Treasurer's Report – Jolene

Status of funds: \$15,700 in checking available, income for April \$437 over 2020 (good news).

### Key Expenses

April had a large church LVE bill (\$790) vs \$698 in 2020.

Parsonage maintenance - shower improvement deposit \$1000.

Overall, expenses are pretty much on track with budget.

### Key Income

Offerings are down about \$8k compared to budget disregarding endowment fund. Likely catch up in summer.

## Treasurer Analysis of Proposed Compensation for Pastor Tim

For background, the 2022 budget assumed \$200/week supply pastor thru June, half year full pastor salary at the rate for Pastor Inger.

Jolene's proposal includes \$58k base annual salary plus medical/retirement, social security, utilities (not compensation - comes direct from Church budget), mileage, education.

Jolene proposed various options including different assessments of the value for the parsonage. As the housing value changes, it affects the 'taxable compensation.'

Jolene also compared the proposed salary to Pastor Beake in American Falls. The salaries are comparable.

Council asked Jolene to develop an additional option assessing the parsonage value as \$4000 per month as market rental value.

## Management

Bath Fitter deposit for parsonage. Work pending material delivery. Brent purchased flooring for delivery based on June 15 move out.

Painting party coming up at parsonage June 20 - was discussed at church 15 May.

## Outreach –

Circle of Care continues support - always looking for help (see Carolyn Daily).

## Worship Board –

Scott is working to find best location for service streaming camera. Audio equipment inbound.

## Transitional Minister –

Scott, Terry, and Brent continue to coordinate with Pastor Tim on logistics support for his trip to Jackson. He arrives Tues night (24 May). On Wednesday, he will take a tour of the area/church/parsonage. Scott and Brent leading tour.

Wednesday night meet and greet potluck.

Scott moves that compensation with Pastor Tim commence using Option 2 (assess parsonage values at \$2500 per month) as a starting point for negotiation. Pam Z seconds. Motion passes after discussion on the housing value assessment.

## 3d Lot

Zoning research ongoing. No response from JH Jewish Community on whether it will undertake and pay for a Zoning Compliance Verification..

## Facility Use Policy

Terry - Management board has reviewed, no comments on policy. Motion to approve policy - William / Scott. Additionally, the fee schedule was discussed, specifically to raise fee for two-hours wedding block from \$200 to \$500. This matches current market rates. Council concurred.

## New Business

Council discussed publication of council meeting minutes. Council supports publication of Meeting Minutes in the monthly newsletter, and posting financial updates on the bulletin board in church. Scott / Brent.

Council also discussed adding a summary at the beginning of each published minutes.

Council discussed developing a policy for parsonage use. Scott / Pam.
